The Milwaukee Audubon Society's 30th annual Natural Landscapes Conference will be held on Saturday, February 13, 2010, at Concordia University Wisconsin's Barth Hall and Todd Wehr Auditorium.

This year's conference is built around the Wisconsin Legislature's declaration of 2010 as the "Year of the Niagara Escarpment," recognizing this unique state geological resource that runs 230 miles from the eastern edge of Horicon Marsh to the tip of Door County. The conference will focus on matters ranging from creating a backyard wildlife habitat to learning about our area's cultural heritage.
